

Chapter 12 Keep Calm and Expecto Patronum

What is your Patronus? Suggested Duration: 50 min.

Lesson Objectives

Students will learn what a Patronus is and how it is linked to the person creating it.

Students will explore positive memories and ways to fend off depression/dementors.

Create a Patronus that represents the student.

Summary of Tasks/Actions

Lesson Planning:

- 1) Students should have finished reading Chapter 12.
- 2) Put the following quote on the board/white board:

"The Patronus is a kind of positive force, a projection of the very things that the Dementors feed upon – hope, happiness, the desire to survive – but it cannot feel despair, as real humans can, so the dementors cannot hurt it"

- 3) Begin a discussion about what this quote means, encouraging students to consider what might fuel their Patronus.
- 4) Provide handout "What is your Patronus" and "Expecto Patronum".

Optional: Create a physical representation of a Patronus using art supplies, media, technology.

Materials/Equipment:

- Optional: Various art supplies and access to technology
